The programme aims to improve the quality of life for children facing adversity by pairing them with a mentor. Mentors meet with their mentees for one hour each week for at least one year.	Wellington
Breast Cancer Support Service Tauranga Trust	\$10,000.00	Funding towards costs for oncology massage and counselling for breast cancer clients to enhance the wellbeing and quality of their lives.	Bay of Plenty
Burnett Foundation Aotearoa (previously NZ Aids Foundation)	\$10,000.00	Funding towards the purchase of HIV self-test kits. People can face many barriers to HIV and STI testing, so providing access to test kits online, and in discrete and safe locations where at-risk populations already visit, helps to remove some barriers by making testing more accessible. Cambridge Disability Enterprise Incorporated	\$1,978.00	Funding for outdoor lighting. This lighting would provide safety and security for evening events for disabled clients and staff.	Waikato

Glaucoma New Zealand	\$8,000.00	Funding towards the promotion and delivery of regional patient education symposiums, to create awareness and information about glaucoma and to distribute education resources. These will be held in Auckland, the Hutt Valley and Timaru.	National
Habitat for Humanity Northern Region Limited	\$25,000.00	Funding towards the costs of developing and delivering a pilot project to build capacity to more holistically support the financial wellbeing of families in their Progressive Home Ownership (PHO) Programme across Auckland and Northland. A Financial Wellbeing Programme specialist (More Than Money) will train and coach PHO staff to deliver tailored financial education and support to PHO participants, aimed at increasing their financial capability and resilience. Heart Kids New Zealand Incorporated	\$11,900.00	Funding to support their national Heart Kids NZ Camp. For many heart children, camp is the highlight of the year: a space to be themselves and connect with others who have had similar experiences. Camp provides respite for families whose lives have been irrevocably changed due to their child's heart differences, knowing their child is in a safe environment with specialised care.	National
Hollyford Conservation Trust - Te Roopu Manaaki o Whakatipu Waitai	\$16,000.00	Funding towards their volunteer stoat trap check, bird monitoring, rodent monitoring and track work based in the Martins Bay, Fiordland area.	Southland
Kidz Social Services Charitable Trust	\$10,000.00	Funding for free counselling and social work support to provide wraparound support for clients and whānau. There has been increased demand for services due to clients who do not fit the criteria for funded counselling either due to their income or reasons for needing counselling.	Auckland

Kindred Family Services	\$10,000.00	Funding for clinical supervision, specialist training and partial salary for a staff member who was a former client. She escaped a life marked by trauma and instability, overwhelmed and emotionally exhausted, she found safety with this charity. Make A Wish Foundation of New Zealand Trust	\$12,000.00	Funding to enable transformational wishes to be delivered to children who are living with a critical illness. Some of the wishes include internal travel and some wishes include assets. The aim is to bring joy to children and their loved ones and leave a profound and lasting impact.	National
Marlborough Four Paws	\$11,898.00	Funding for the essential vet bills associated with de-sexing the stray and dumped animals in their community. Increased financial pressures on families have resulted in more animals being abandoned.	Nelson/ Marlborough
Maungatautari Ecological Island Trust	\$3,775.00	Funding for a water heater. The facility needs a new water heater to meet health and safety standards. They provide oversight and governance in managing the ecological restoration of Maungatautari.	Waikato
New Zealand Endometriosis Foundation Charitable Trust	\$10,000.00	Funding to develop a new resource (digital and physical copies) that reflects the needs of endometriosis sufferers and the wider community. The new resources will cover topics such as self-management, relationships, diagnosis, fertility, and navigating health systems.	National
Ōkārito Native Plants Trust Board	\$6,214.00	Funding to purchase a new galvanised trailer that can be used as part of the Ōkārito Plant Project. Stepping Stone Trust	\$20,000.00	Funding towards programmes to help and support children whose parents have a mental illness. They provide early intervention services to children, which can prevent or mitigate the negative impact of parental mental illness on a child's wellbeing and build resilience.	Canterbury
Tamai Sports Incorporated	\$10,000.00	Funding towards the Programme Manager's Salary. This organisation works to remove barriers to participation in sporting activities for tamariki, aged 8-12 years old. They equip, encourage, and empower tamariki and whānau to participate in sport and improve their health and wellbeing. The Programme Manager is responsible for the design and delivery of the programmes.	Canterbury

The Little Miracles Trust	\$11,941.00	Funding towards the production of expert insight podcasts and lived experience videos to assist families who have a baby in a neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). These resources, combined with the face-to-face support their NICU teams provide, will help meet the needs of these families.	National

Wellington Volunteer Centre	\$5,000.00	Funding towards the Youth Impact Project, which aims to increase youth engagement and participation in community activities and volunteering. Youth volunteering provides young people with opportunities to develop essential life skills, such as communication, teamwork, problem-solving, and leadership.	Wellington
Wellington Zoo Trust	\$11,455.00	Funding towards equipment for the specialty wildlife hospital. The hospital treats native wildlife patients, including some of the most endangered species. The hospital also looks after the health of Zoo residents, who also have procedures and health checks there.	Wellington
West Coast Penguin Trust	\$5,000.00	Funding towards the education programme, which provides children with an understanding of and appreciation for local penguins and nature and supports them to develop and take conservation actions to help.	West Coast
Who Did You Help Today Trust	\$12,000.00	Funding to provide end-of-year activity packs to tamariki across their Homework Club network. The purpose of the packs is to enable tamariki to continue their learning at home over the summer holidays, and to share the packs with their family to encourage whānau time.	National
